

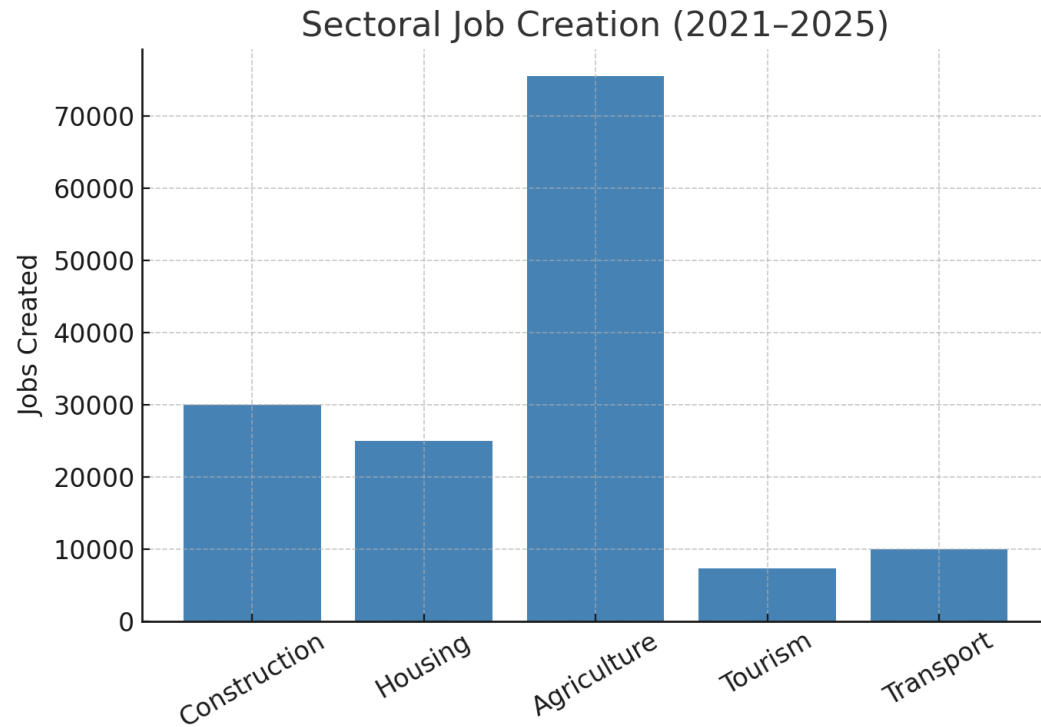
Guyana Job Creation & Labour Market Outlook (2021–2030)

Key Achievements (2021–2025)

- $\geq 70,000$ sustainable jobs created (2021–2025), surpassing 50,000 target
- Conservative estimate excludes manufacturing & informal jobs
- 67,905 new employees registered with NIS; adjusted total 72,293
- Construction: 30,000 jobs | Housing: 25,000 jobs
- Agriculture: 75,572 persons trained/capacity built
- Tourism & Hospitality: 7,300 jobs | Transport: 10,000 new drivers (minibus and hire cars assuming 50% of the 20,000 new registrations are new and 50% current drivers upgrading their vehicles), and 11,000+ new truck drivers, bringing the total to 21,000

Methodology: Anchoring Credibility

- Baseline: 2021 Q3 Guyana Labour Force Survey (GLFS)
- Variance analysis with Bank of Guyana labour & population estimates
- Sector-specific indicators: construction, housing, agriculture, tourism, transport
- Employment extrapolation using contracts, mortgages, training & licenses
- Data triangulation with GLFS, BoG, and NIS registrations (67,905 new employees)
- Adjusted estimate: $\geq 70,000$ jobs, conservative by excluding manufacturing & informal jobs
- Corroborated with administrative and macroeconomic records
